

Directions to Nevins Hall, Framingham

Nevins Hall, Memorial Building
150 Concord Street

This facility is handicapped accessible. From the parking lot in the back of the building, enter through the far-left entrance toward Concord Street. A handicapped parking sign marks the entrance. Once in the building, the elevator takes you to the main floor.

From Mass Pike

Take exit 13 (Framingham/Natick exit)

After the tolls, bear right down the exit ramp to Route 30 (west).

Proceed west on Route 30 through several sets of traffic lights (approximately four or five). Turn left on to Route 126 South/Concord Street. (Shell Gas Station will be on your right as you bear left.)

After three traffic lights (approximately three or four miles), the Memorial Building (a tan brick building with a large pillared entry) is on your right as you come into a rotary-type intersection. (Landmarks you will pass along Concord Street include a Fire Station on your right, Exxon Gas station on your left, Dunkin Donuts on your right.)

From Route 9 - Heading West

Take Route 9 to Route 126 South (Concord Street) - follow directions as outlined above.

From Route 9 - Heading East

Stay on Route 9 to Framingham. At the set of lights by Stop and Shop (Temple Street) you should get in the right lane. Go straight through this set of lights. Take the next exit ramp off Route 9, on your right. Exit sign reads: Edgell Road/Main Street/Framingham. On the exit road, stay in the right lane and follow signs for "Main Street".

At traffic light take a right onto Main Street. Main Street becomes Union Avenue after several blocks. Follow Union Avenue for a couple of miles, which brings you into Downtown Framingham. The Memorial Building (a tan brick building with a large pillared entry) will be on your left.

From Route 135 – Heading either east or west

At the intersection of Routes 135 and 126, turn onto Route 126 North. Cross the railroad tracks and travel through one intersection. Beyond the intersection, you will see the Memorial Building (a tan brick building with a large pillared entry) directly in front of you.

Parking

There is a free municipal parking lot behind the building. On-street parking is free on weekends.
